Yet another misty, drizzly, overcast cold count day. 64 species for a rather slow day isn't bad—better than last year by 11 species.

- Highlights included Snow Goose, Greater White-fronted Geese, six Short-eared Owls (high count) and common redpolls (really high count; last high count was in 2007-8), and high count for Northern Mockingbird.
- Open water at LaDue allowed for some waterfowl that we don't always get.
- A Meadowlark was nice.
- Tree Sparrows did only slightly better than last year. Third year in a row for low count.
- Red-Shouldered and Red-tailed Hawk numbers were better than last year. And always nice to get Northern Harrier and Rough-legged Hawk on our count.
